Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon in April, in Spring. The word « Easter » comes from « Eostre », the Anglo-Saxon goddess of Spring.

Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. Many people celebrate the beginning of Spring.

Eggs, bunnies, chicks, lambs and flowers (like daffodils) are associated with Easter because they are born in Spring. They symbolize new life.

- **Hunt the eggs:** the legend says an Easter bunny hides eggs in the garden and children have to find the eggs.
- **Eggs rolling:** it is very popular in England. Children roll eggs down a hill.

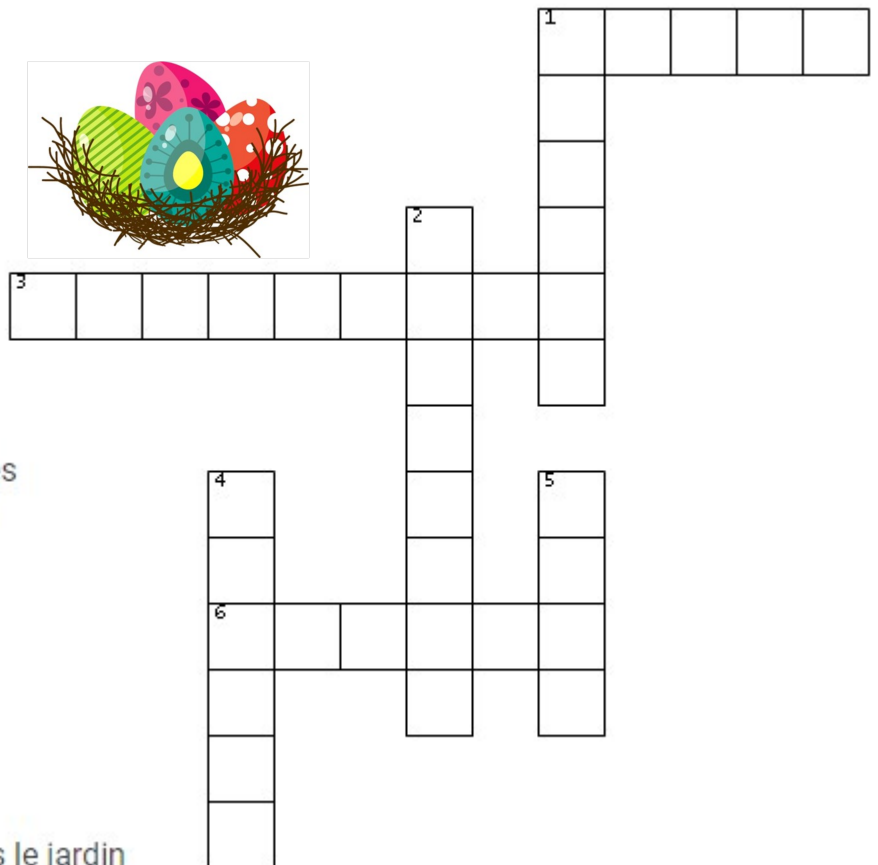
